**Proclamation**




- WHEREAS:** Lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and questioning (LGBTQ) young people are 120% more likely to experience homelessness than non-LGBTQ youth, and
- WHEREAS:** across the world, young people in collaboration with adult partners are making significant progress to end youth homelessness, and
- WHEREAS:** True Colors Day was established as an international day of action and advocacy around LGBTQ youth homelessness, and
- WHEREAS:** on True Colors Day, people around the world will speak out in a unified voice and take coordinated action to defend the civil rights of LGBTQ youth experiencing homelessness, and
- WHEREAS:** it is fitting and proper on True Colors Day and on every day to recognize the tremendous impact of youth leadership and the work to end homelessness among all populations in the City of Fayetteville.

**NOW THEREFORE, I, Lioneld Jordan, Mayor of the City of Fayetteville, Arkansas do hereby proclaim April 29, 2020 as**
